The History of Memorial Day

Technically, summer doesn't start until June 21. But many people ( 31 ) Memorial Day to be the unofficial start of the season. This year, we celebrate ( 32 ) holiday on May 29. Many families will heat up the grill or head to the beach. ( 33 ) Memorial Day has the word memorial in it for a reason.

The national holiday got started on May 30, 1868. Union general John A. Logan declared the day an occasion ( 34 ) the graves of Civil War soldiers. He called it Decoration Day. After World War I, the holiday was more ( 35 ) called Memorial Day.

In 1950, President Harry S. Truman made a statement that broadened<sup>注1</sup> the ( 36 ) of Memorial Day. He asked Americans to also observe<sup>注2</sup> the holiday ( 37 ) a day of prayer for peace. President Richard M. Nixon declared Memorial Day a federal holiday in 1971.

Memorial Day is now observed every year on the ( 38 ) Monday of May. It honors the members of the U.S. military ( 39 ) died in American wars. One of the biggest Memorial Day traditions is for the president or vice president to give a speech. ( 40 ) is for the president or vice president to lay a wreath<sup>注3</sup> on soldiers' graves in the largest U.S. military burial ground<sup>注4</sup>, Arlington National Cemetery, in Virginia.
